The feeding of horses has traditionally been more of an art than a science. There has been a great increase in equine nutrition research in the last 20 years, both overseas and in New Zealand. As a result, the feeding of horses is now becoming much more scientific, and may seem overly complicated.

A very small amount of the research has been done under our unique pasture based rearing and training systems.

Pasture is cheap and readily available in New Zealand for most of the year. We will look at the benefits of pasture, horse-related problems associated with pasture, and best management practices.

Erica is a Massey University graduate who is currently a Senior Lecturer in Equine Science in the Institute of Veterinary, Animal and Biomedical Sciences at Massey University. In this role Erica is actively involved in teaching, research and clinical service.

Erica's main research interests are in equine nutrition and reproduction. Erica completed a PhD investigating the role of copper nutrition in the pregnant mare, and the effects on growth and development of the foal.

More recently she completed a residency training programme in equine reproduction at the Equine Reproduction Laboratory, Colorado State University.

Erica is a Diplomate of the American College of Theriogenology, and is a registered specialist in equine reproduction in New Zealand.
